WHO WE ARE

Fifteen years ago, a group of lifelong Brooklynites came together with a big idea for Brooklyn.

Created in 2009, Brooklyn Org is the first-ever public foundation solely dedicated to championing the borough's communities and the nonprofits committed to bettering the lives of our neighbors. Aimed at leveraging the borough's exponentially increasing population and global influence, we are raising new resources to address deeply rooted inequities and systemic injustice from the ground up.

Today, Brooklyn Org is an inclusive, dynamic, passionate, and quickly growing community of Brooklynites from every neighborhood, sharing one powerful common belief that together we can spark change for a more fair and just Brooklyn:



Nonprofits

We are the advocate for Brooklyn's nonprofit community. We fund over 100 organizations annually working across every issue, while we invest in the development of emerging nonprofits and leaders.



Donors

We crowdfund resources from Brooklyn, for Brooklyn, and use our deep knowledge and experience to co-invest strategically in our communities.



Partners

We collaborate with Brooklyn believers—businesses, government, foundations, and more—to further our shared vision for a stronger Brooklyn.



Communities

We are connected to communities and cultures across Brooklyn—and these long-standing relationships play a key role in informing our investments.

Together we have moved over \$120M to nonprofits since 2009, but more critically, we are driven by a relentless commitment to racial justice and making Brooklyn a beacon of equity—where our diversity is our strength, needs are met with solutions, and everyone can prosper and thrive.

A Beacon for Equity and Justice

Home to nearly 3 million people, Brooklyn is New York City's largest borough and would be the country's third largest city. Known as a center of cultural, artistic, and economic innovation, Brooklyn is a microcosm of America with huge disparities in wealth and social outcomes between white residents and people of color and immigrants, exacerbated by the rising cost of living, lack of affordable housing, and food insecurity.

In the face of these challenges, Brooklyn has become a hub for social movements and changemakers who are creating community-driven approaches ripe for expansion and acceleration.

Our nonprofits are the first responders in times of crisis and everyday emergencies, yet—despite accounting for over 1/3 of New York City’s nonprofits—**Brooklyn organizations receive less than 8% of charitable contributions citywide each year.**

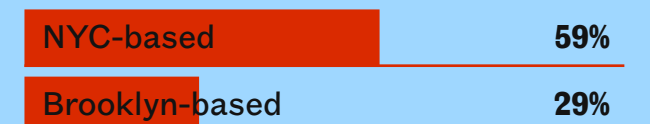

WHO WE BACK

In 2023, Brooklyn Org's community of supporters powered our \$5M investment in racial justice, social support, and economic opportunity for Brooklyn.

Our Community-led Approach

Brooklyn Org is creating a new model for local philanthropy that gives everyone a seat at the table through both our strategic support of local nonprofits and our partnerships with Donor Advised Funds.

Our sector demands disruption: only 10% of philanthropic dollars nationally have been invested in nonprofits led by people of color over the past 20 years, even as overall giving has increased nearly 400%. We take racial inequities like these as calls to action to do philanthropy differently, making investments in partnership with Brooklyn residents and building a community of donors from all walks of life.

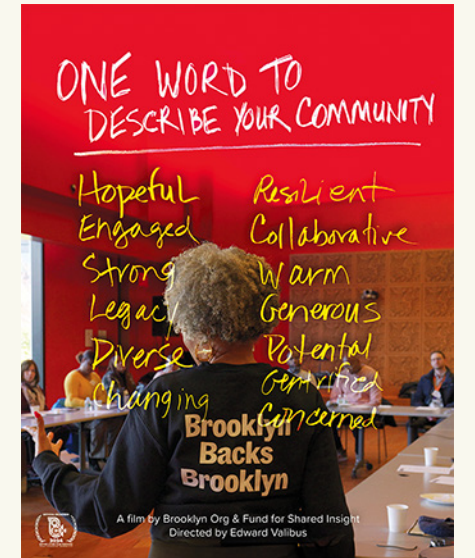

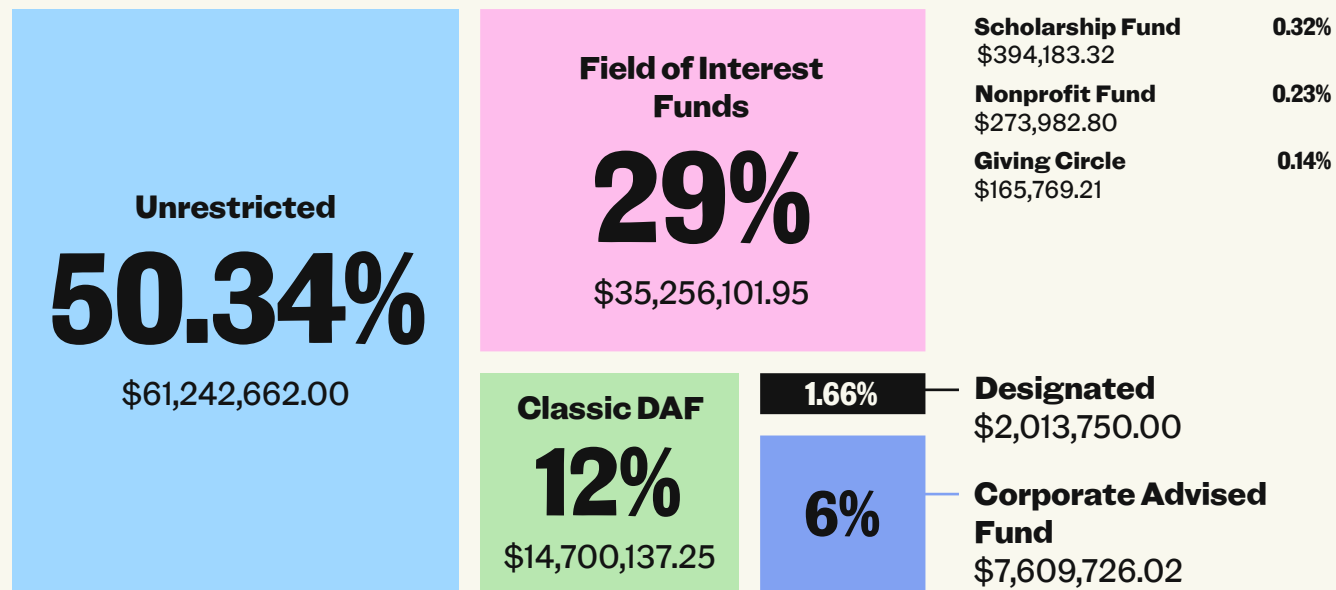

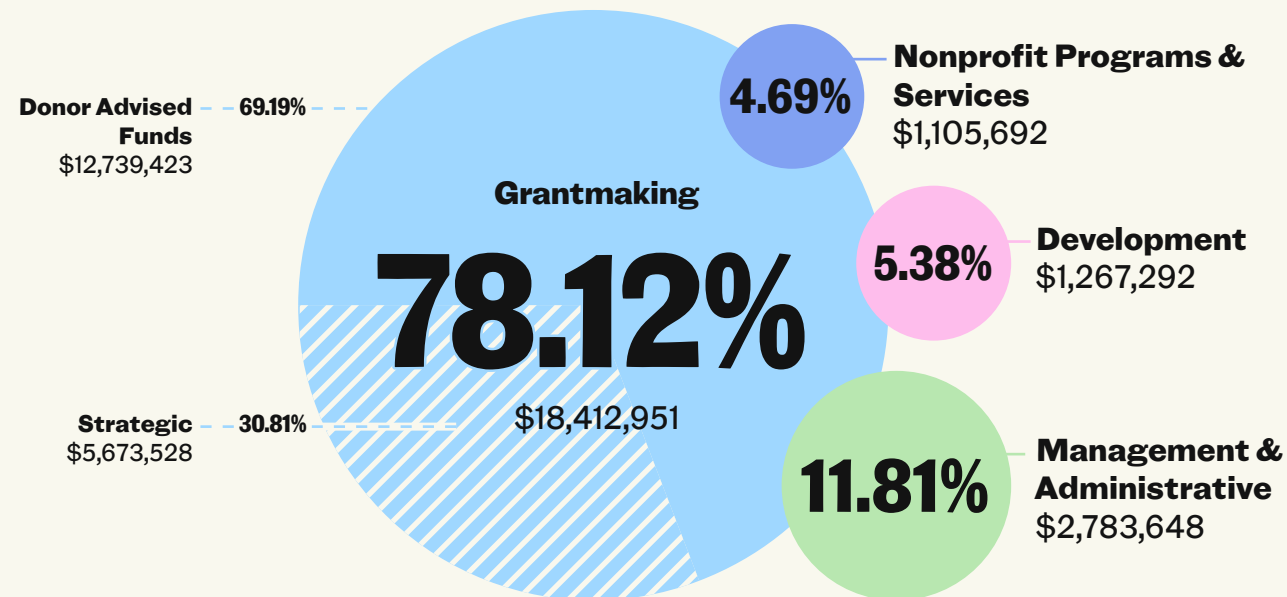
